### George Patton 'Pat' Waters Addressed the Chapter



Pat Waters provided an entertaining and unique perspective on the life of his grandfather General George S. Patton, Jr. at our October meeting. A veteran of the US Navy and a successful businessman before he retired, Pat now lives in Mt. Pleasant. His remarks reflected his experience as a young boy's personal though limited interactions with his grandfather, the famous World War II general. He also noted

pieces of General Patton's history, largely unknown by the general public, including his 12 years of home schooling, his dyslexic, his rejection by the US Military Academy before being accepted on his second try. In his closing remarks, Pat challenged America's civilians and its military veterans to remember the mothers who raise and nurture the young men and women who serve our country.

The Board of Directors has voted to change the Chapter's fiscal year from a July 1 to June 30 fiscal year to a October 1 to Sept 30 fiscal year. This decision was made to enhance certainty into Chapter revenue and expenditures. Rather than making estimates of Chapter revenue and expenditures as we have in the past, the Board will now make its budget decisions based on actual numbers. Consequently, we have begun the new fiscal year with all expenditures previously authorized by the Board for 2018 having been made. To begin the new fiscal year, our end of September balances are:

## Chaplain's Corner by Greg Hill

Our September meeting had to be cancelled due to Hurricane Florence. I trust you weathered that storm OK. I was heartened to see all the help our neighbors gave one another to prepare, endure and recover from that storm.

During our September meeting, we planned to take a moment to remember September 11, 2001, a day that changed our understanding of the world. We were to take a moment to reflect on the life of Robert Hawkins, a quiet man who played such key roles in our MOAA chapter over the years.

In September, our guest speaker was to be Col Mike Turner, USAF (Ret), Vice President, Development, National MOAA. He was to speak to us about the MOAA Military Family Initiative (MMFI) Community Outreach Grant program. Our local chapter has received an MMFI grant two years in a row. Thus far this year, we have used portions of this grant to service and put new tires on the Low Country Veterans Group's van. This van is used to transport Georgetown County Veterans to medical appointments at the Charleston VA Medical Center, Myrtle Beach VA Clinic, and area doctor appointments. Other MMFI grant funds will be used to support Georgetown County disadvantaged Veterans.

We have also been granted a Homes for Heroes Grant which

will be used to support our area Veterans which will be presented to our Chapter in October.

Friendship Place in Georgetown, who provides food, housing and work for Georgetown County poor residents, received a \$600.00 grant from our Chapter. The Director of Friendship Place, Charlie Ball, is a Veteran.

I want to thank all those who participated in the Myrtle Beach Stand Down in any way. Homeless Veterans must remain an ongoing target audience for intentional efforts by our Chapter.

As I write this article Hurricane Michael is about to strike the Florida Panhandle. We, too, will be affected by this Hurricane. Please continue to be watchful over your neighbors and family.

With Veterans Day approaching, I ask that you take the time to attend a parade, wreath laying ceremony, or visit a local Eggs Up Grill on November 9 to support their Breakfast with a Veteran program. 15% of all sales will benefit our MOAA Chapter's Veteran outreach efforts in Georgetown and Horry Counties.

I trust you had a wonderful summer and I pray you will take advantage of our many meaningful MOAA programs this fall.

## Stand Down 2018 Another Success

Hurricane Florence may have interfered with the annual Stand Down for homeless, near homeless and needy veterans, but it did not dampen the enthusiasm for its sponsors or participants. The storm caused a one-week delay in the execution of the event, and the accompanying evacuation of area residents led to a limited shortage of volunteers. Nonetheless, a yet undetermined number of veterans sought and received needed assistance from the numerous sponsors. This was the fifth year for Stand Down in Myrtle Beach and the fourth year in which the Grand Strand Chapter was a principal sponsor. The Board budgeted \$4000 for veterans outreach in 2018. Most of that money is expended for purchase and distribution of blankets, warm-up kits, and other items for needy veterans. Sponsoring groups will meet to determine the number of veterans who received assistance during the event. Kudos to Chapter Chairman of Veterans Outreach Mike Freeman and his dedicated band of volunteers who ensured the success of Stand Down 2018.
