Chapter Supports ROTC at Coastal Carolina University

The Grand Strand Chapter continues to foster its relationship with Coastal Carolina University's (CCU) Army ROTC unit. On 12 February, President Youngman, 1st VP Tony Prince and 2nd VP Bob Hawkins met with seven senior ROTC cadets eligible for the free basic MOAA National membership. The cadets were apprised of the many Chapter outreach activities in the greater MB area, as well as the importance of joining the brotherhood of commissioned officers and the resultant development of lifelong relationships. President Youngman touched upon a number of national concerns such as sequestration and downsizing, stressing the need to become familiar with issues affecting their first assignments as commissioned officers. Five cadets are scheduled to finish in May and the other two are scheduled to graduate in August.

ROTC Night will be held in conjunction with the April 14th meeting at Pine Lakes Country Club. The five eligible seniors graduating in May will be our guests. The CCU ROTC Color Guard will be in attendance to present the Colors. At the meeting, the Chapter will host a special awards ceremony to present the MOAA National Gold Bar Awards. In addition, the top leadership cadet in their class will be honored. As in the past, the chapter will recognize their commissioning ceremony as Second Lieutenants at graduation in May.

As part of the curriculum, cadets are required to prepare and present briefings on their analysis of a significant historic battle. The cadre's commander, MAJ Chad Hodkins, invited our chapter to participate. Accordingly, the chapter will form two Senior Officer Academic Review Teams to assist the cadets in the preparation of historic battle analyses. Chapter members are also invited to sit in on the briefings and the follow-on Q & A session.

A new joint initiative is under development, ROTC College Day. The concept is for ROTC cadets to host the region's 18 high school JROTC programs in a Field Day. The event will include fun competitions, learning exercises, and of course, food. September is the target month. Further information will be provided as plans firm up.

MOAA Stand Down 2015 Partnership with AARP

MOAA Grand Strand Chapter has sought to expand our personal affairs mission with the greater Myrtle Beach and Grand Strand community as it relates to eliminating homelessness among military veterans. This effort is an outcome of our October 2014 chapter meeting, round table strategy sessions for the new 2015 operational year. This year's MOAA outreach effort includes a partnership with the South Carolina, AARP Outreach Division, under the leadership of Ms. Doris Gleason, AARP Outreach Director. Through the efforts and inputs from the MOAA Personal Affairs Committee (Rufus T. Manning, Greg Hill, Harry Dubose and Sonny Edens), the President of the MOAA Chapter, and the MOAA Board of Directors (BOD), a series of meetings with various veteran organizations, and the AARP Outreach Director, led to the formal agreement as of the February 2015 BOD session, and subsequent presentation at the February MOAA Chapter meeting.

As a prior year activity, the Myrtle Beach Stand Down 2014 event, resulted in a very successful outreach to our homeless veteran community, and provided another platform to position MOAA as an active Myrtle Beach organization supporting community issues. As an official Co-Sponsor for this year's 2015 event, we will expand our role by organizing and partnering with a variety of local and State level organizations in support of this very worthy cause.

The specific calendar of events, to include pre-planning meetings, is well underway. Stand Down 2015 is set for September 18, 2015, at the Market Common Army Reserve Center. This year's list of partners were notified as of Jan 2, 2014. A second notice will sent by early March 2015. A team meeting is tentatively scheduled for April 2015. A second team meeting is set for August 2015, followed by the actual Stand Down in September of 2015. Questions about how the MOAA membership can get involved will be addressed at our regularly scheduled monthly meetings or you can directly contact our Personal Affairs Committee members.

Legislative Tidbits

The key Legislative item the Chapter currently is supporting through a *Call-To-Action* is "South Carolina Giving Back to Our Veterans Act". At our recent dinner meeting, I highlighted the details of this particular legislation which would exempt military retirement pay from South Carolina taxation. As should be expected, chapter members (and others) tend to mobilize and support initiatives that potentially affect them, and as in this case, their pocketbooks directly. From the calls and requests for copies of the petition provided at the meeting and by subsequent email, I am optimistic our Chapter will garner more than our target of 1,000 support signatures. As of February 22nd, more than 150 have been given to me. Thanks to those of you that worked for these and those that are still working to get signatures by the March 10th target date.



The legislation in its current form would reduce military retirement pay taxes by 33.33% for tax year 2015, in tax year 2016 by 66.67%, and be tax free for tax year 2017. As stated in the petition, this legislation would be a major step toward South Carolina achieving Veteran-Friendly status, thus benefiting the state financially by attracting more military retirees, which 2013 data reports as being over 57,500.

Biggest and Best Military Appreciation Days This Year


